"and suddenly from heaven came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting" (Acts 2:2 NRSV)

Last week (as I write this mid-February), a worship service ended at Asbury University in Wilmore, Kentucky. Nothing especially memorable about that. They have chapel three times a week. When I attended there, chapel was mandatory. I'm not sure it is at this time. But it's a part of the regular life of the school.

But this week was different. After the service, a few students lingered, worshiped, and began to confess to one another some of their sins and things they needed God to heal. It was then that something unexpected happened. The Holy Spirit showed up in a very powerful way. The service did not end. In faith has still not ended, some 130 hours. The Auditorium, which sits



around 1,300 to 1,400 people, is filled to capacity. There are people on the steps. The chapel across the street is filled, as well. The town is filled with thousands of people, many not from the community. Someone likened it to the end of "Field of Dreams" as headlights fill the road like people streamed to the baseball field. It's spilled over to other campuses and to churches, as well.

More than an incredible time of worship, people have given their life to Christ. People have rededicated their lives to Christ. There has been healing and reconciliation. Lives changed. This is what happens when the Holy Spirit manifests Himself in powerful ways.

It's not the first time this has happened there. It happened in the late 50's, and more famously in 1970. What's interesting is that ever since that revival, people have prayed for it to happen every year. And it didn't happen. I would have loved for it to have happened when I was there. So why now?

There is no real answer to that question. There is a wild and unknowable part of God's personality. He cannot be controlled or manipulated. But it occurs to me there are some things we can learn here that I think can be helpful for us as we move through Lent together.

Just because we did not experience a revival like this, it does not mean the Holy Spirit didn't move in our lives. In fact, some of the greatest spiritual moments in my life occurred there. The Holy Spirit did move. As Christians, our role is not to demand that God comes in a specific way. Our role is to see how the Holy Spirit is moving in our lives at that moment. The guestion is not if, or even when. It's how.

Secondly, God is a creative God. Just look at all the beauty in the world. God does not always come in the same expected ways. We need to be aware God will move in our lives in unexpected ways. Let's not miss what God is doing merely because we were looking the wrong way.


Thirdly, The Holy Spirit is interruptive. He changes our lives. Understand if you are seeking the Holy Spirit, He's going to change your life. It will not be the same.

Finally, while we can't control revival, it seems to always come after a time of prayer, confession, and repentance. Spend your time of Lent wisely. Look for God. Spend time with Him, confess and repent. And look for the Holy Spirit to come.







Welcome to the Trustees' Corner


Trustees here to give you the latest update on our Capital Campaign. We have vetted a General Contractor (GC), Bill Burch, Drummond Construction, Inc., and the total cost of renovations is \$1,954,000. Currently, we have received a grand total of \$1,113,094.58 Capital Campaign funds. Out of that amount, we have spent \$229,246.75 on the new doors, permits, architect and engineer fees, and storage container fees. This leaves us with \$889,339.71 remaining of Capital Campaign funds raised thus far which includes the interest gained from the CD investments and Money Market Account. We have other funds available to absorb some of the difference, but any additional giving in your hearts towards the Capital Campaign would be greatly appreciated. Our next step for the renovations since vetting a GC is



that we have applied for the permits with the city to approve our plans. We know this has been a long awaited start to fixing our ever need to improve the infrastructure of our church, but we are finally here and appreciate your giving toward, your patience, and most of all your prayers as we go through the process. In each monthly *Circuit Rider*, we will continue to share the progress and status of the Capital Campaign renovations.







Stop by the Church Library!





Creative Ministries News

Our Egg Stuffing Event will take place at Crossroads on March 25th. We will <u>begin at 9 a.m</u>. and go until we run out of eggs and candy. The more hands we have, the quicker we will get finished! We usually have around 14,000 eggs to fill so we appreciate your help. You can arrive or leave as needed. The event will take place in the 4 square room.

Collection boxes are in the church parlor and Crossroads main hallway for donations of plastic eggs, (which are probably cheaper than real ones), and non-chocolate candies that will fit inside of eggs.

Candies like Tootsie Rolls, Jolly Ranchers and Starbursts are good fits for eggs. Smartees and Dum Dums are too long to fit inside of most eggs. Here are some good and bad examples:





Eggstravaganza will happen on **April 1st**. We will hide eggs at 9 a.m. Volunteers are needed to hide the 14,000 or so eggs around the Crossroads property. It is usually chilly out and the ground is wet so I recommend that you bring a spare pair of shoes and socks and a pair of gloves with you. 
