


The joyous Easter Sunday celebration will happen on April 9th at 9:00 and 10:30 a.m.

How is God calling you to be a part of Holy Week this year? Who is God calling you to invite to experience worship with you? Let's journey together!

"Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples "I have seen the Lord" (John 20:18 NRSV)

As we continue to move through Lent, I find myself thinking about Holy Week. Being laid up these past few weeks has forced me to be a bit more aware of Lent and our need to slow down and contemplate life and our faith. That's a bit of what Lent is about. It's about slowing down and turning inward and upward.

As we approach the Easter season, I've been thinking about Mary's words. Can you imagine? She and the disciples have gone through what must have been the most tragic event in all of human history. The joy of the triumphant entry shattered by the arrest, the beating and the death of Jesus. And then that horrible Sabbath where nothing happens.



But then that darkness is shattered by Mary running into the disciples saying, I have seen the Lord. She and the women had seen the angels. John and Peter had found an empty grave. But it is Mary who is the first witness to the resurrected Jesus. And her first response is to go back to the people she loves and share that she has seen Jesus.

There's something powerful about the idea that it's Mary who first sees Jesus. Jesus doesn't appear to Pilate or to the Sanhedrin showing them up for being wrong and proclaiming His Kingdom. It's not to His Disciples, those faithful followers who stood by Him the last three years. It's not even to Peter, James and John, Jesus' closest friends. It's to Mary Magdalene.

I have a few ideas as to why this must be. It could be because the resurrection mirrors the Nativity. In both cases, Jesus comes in unexpected ways, being announced to those who were considered the least in society.

And I'm sure that's a part of it. But I think it's also because Mary Magdalene lingers. She is the only one not to rush away from the empty tomb. She waits, she lingers, and in the place Jesus comes. And the world is changed by her testimony.

I want to encourage you not to leave Easter too quickly. Linger, listen, pray. Seek the presence of the resurrected Lord. See Jesus. And then go and tell someone that you have seen Jesus.



There are three components of our Visitation Ministries -1) visiting those residing in nursing facilities, 2) those who are homebound in their personal home, and 3) those in the hospital or recovering in a rehabilitation facility.

abatement process is complete, the General Contractor will be getting the sub-contractors lined up to start the renovation process. As each month


goes by, we will continue to share the progress. Be sure to stay tuned each month and read our article.






Book- "All Cracked Up, Experiencing God in the broken places" by Patsy Clairmont

Virtuous Reality celebrates 30 years!

Our blacklight theater team has been doing ministry since 1993. We began as a "mixed puppetry" ministry using Muppet style "white light" puppets along with blacklight

> Christian puppetry conference created by a major puppet resource company. They asked us to do a 20 minute presentation and then proceeded to tell us what numbers NOT to do. (These were the skits produced by their competitors.) The banned numbers happened to be most of our white light skits, so our show ended up being 95% blacklight.

Our performance was received with great reviews from the audience, but the next day, the owner of the puppet resource company taught a class on puppetry and said "You can't do all blacklight. Last night's show was a perfect example." A member of our team was in the class and reported what was said. We made the decision right then and there that," from now on, we are ALL BLACKLIGHT!" We never looked back and never regretted our decision. People LOVE blacklight puppetry and older puppeteers like that, they don't have to get on their knees and crawl around!

In our 30 years, we have performed at many national Christian conferences, from Gettysburg to Mississippi. We have done several "Florida Tours", where we performed our way to Florida and back. When we couldn't find resources on how to do blacklight ministry, we created our own DVD series which has sold across the country as well as internationally.

Our director, John Coen, has had the privilege of teaching at Christian ministry conferences in Malaysia and Indonesia on two different occasions. He also taught at a Chinese church camp for two Summers.

This July, we plan to attend the Fellowship of Christian Puppeteers national conference in Hagerstown, Maryland. We hope to perform and teach while there.

Gift To Wings Of The Morning

Wings of the Morning is an aviation ministry of The United Methodist Church in North Katanga in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) in central Africa and is under the care and supervision of the General Board of Global Ministries. This ministry is based in Lubumbashi, the second largest city in the DRC. With little or no transportation infrastructure, such as paved roads or a railway system, the Wings of the Morning airplane is a lifeline to the 6 million people of the Katanga province, providing vital services, such as...

Carrying life-giving medications, vaccines, and supplies to remote villages and towns Transporting critically ill patients to clinics and hospitals Providing transportation for pastors, missionaries, and volunteers Delivering payroll and other supplies to villages, towns, and churches Transporting government leaders for peace negotiations

Due to supply chain issues and government paperwork delays, the much-loved Cessna aircraft provided by West Ohio to the North Katanga Conference Wings of the Morning ministry has been unexpectedly grounded for nearly 6 months awaiting necessary repairs. This means there have been no flights to the remote locations that the ministry serves in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) – no emergency medications or supplies getting in, no emergency medical evacuations getting out, and no corporate sponsors helping to offset operating costs. Although the costs for the major maintenance are covered thanks in part to the Wings of the Morning Endowment Fund, operating reserves are now depleted, and staff may need to be laid off.

Bishop Palmer, the West Ohio Conference Office of Connectional Ministries, and the UMFWO made a special urgent appeal to help Wings of the Morning. We have responded with a \$500.00 gift from our Kroger account to Wings of the Morning. This will help cover immediate needs for operational support including staff salaries, airplane documentation fees, hanger fees, and fuel costs – all necessary costs for getting the ministry back up and flying this spring, just in time for the rainy season in the DRC.

We are in mission to the world helping to lighten the load for missionaries Jeanne and Gaston Ntambo!




