Be thou my vision, O Lord of my heart; naught be all else to me, save that thou art. Thou my best thought, by day or by night, waking or sleeping, thy presence my light. (Be Thou My Vision UM Hymnal #451, A Traditional Irish Melody, translated by Mary E. Byrne, 1905; versed by Eleanor H. Hull, 1912.)

This is the first stanza of my favorite hymn, #451 in the United Methodist Hymnal. As a person who did not know the love of God for myself until my early twenties, I struggled to figure out my life's purpose and my path. I was restless as uncertainty seemed to batter me back and forth like a small boat on a hostile sea. Have you ever found yourself being swayed back and forth by the craziness of life's circumstances? By competing voices urging you to choose this way or that? By decisions big and small that all add up to confusion?

The words of this hymn are words that I sing as a prayer. As a prayer, singing redirects me to keep my focus on Christ—on the way of peace and the way of love. For three years, the disciples followed Jesus, learning from the way He embodied God's law by genuinely loving God's people. When His disciples struggled, Jesus gathered them together to offer them compassion and direction that would help them discern their way through life's storms.



Jesus' solitary focus was embodying God's law by loving God's people.

And Jesus was the vision the disciples learned to trust. He was their vision. And Jesus is our vision, as well.

September is Kick-off month. The Pastor's Bible Study begins again in earnest after summer break for vacation. Children's Sunday School restarts. Our programming runs at full-tilt, and our choir and bells return to lead us in worship. I am so excited to be a part of this faith community.

Card Ministry – "Reach out and touch someone!" Remember that AT&T slogan? For our members and friends who are no longer able to attend church services, a personalized, handwritten note on a card reminds them that their church family loves them and prays for them. How can you help? Donate handmade or other greeting cards especially Birthday, Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas), or provide some stamps for mailing – become a "Card Minister' and help connect with those who are homebound or convalescing in a nursing facility.

Blood Pressure Screenings – Tracking blood pressure over time can help in alerting us to health problems that might otherwise go undetected. Trainer personnel are available the first Sunday of each month to take your blood pressure

so you can share that information with your health provider. Visit Room 14 in the Parlor/Hospitality area, 9:45 – 10:30am.


Childcare for children aged four and under will be in Room 12 on the 1st floor during the 9:00 and 10:30 services.

Our Local Relief... is their relief

For those that don't know, Fairfield County 211 (211) is a central hub of information and referral for those in the community that need assistance. Our church has continued to grow our partnership into a close relationship with 211. Through the years and still to this day, we assist with things like rent, utility shut-offs, car repairs, and even obtaining birth certificates.

In the past couple of years, 211 has expanded assistance beyond the daily life needs. One thing that a lot of households take for granted is being able to celebrate a child's birthday. There are a lot of parents and even grandparents raising grandchildren that barely have enough to provide their day-to-day needs. Could you imagine not even having money to buy a birthday cake or even bake one for your child, let alone buying them one gift to celebrate their special day? A new program that is only a couple of years old is the **Birthday Bag Project**. Each bag is filled with all the pantry items needed to bake a cake, decorations. and a gift or gifts for a child. The Birthday Bag Project is for children turning one year old up through teenager. It's amazing what your dollars can do to help a parent make a child's day, especially their birthday. Last year, we helped be a part of putting together over 250 birthday bags. The proof is in the picture, seeing the room full of Birthday Bags ready to surprise a child. With such success, our church contributed towards the project again this year in hopes of going beyond the 250 families that we helped last year. Your continued efforts to give toward

Welcome to the Trustees' Corner

Have you been itching to hear the latest update of how things are progressing in the basement of the church? Well, here is what is happening now. The plumbers have moved on from digging ditches to laying new pipes for water, sanitation, and storm water drainage. You can actually start to see how the new bathrooms are going to be laid out with the pipes in place, and there is a new sump pump going in. Not all the areas involved in the renovation are below ground, some are up high. It might have looked like the Halloween bats are starting to hangout in the bell tower or the roof



edges, but it is just the plumbers and the general contractor up top verifying the flow of gutters for storm water drainage.





Here is the latest update on figures. To date we have received a little over \$1.166 million cash. Reminder that the overall job cost ended up coming in at a little over \$2.1 million, leaving almost \$935k in cost above what we have received to date through the Capital Campaign. We are grateful for all the gifts given thus far to the Capital Campaign; any additional giving in your heart would be greatly appreciated to help make up for the difference between the project cost and the cash received to date.
