I have been walking with you on this faith journey for two full months, now. I am so grateful to be your pastor and to be living out our faith together. As I have come into this established community of disciples, I have seen so much beauty and a desire to live into Christ's call to follow Him. At our staff worship this week, our devotion leader was Dustin Roberts. He spoke from his heart from Ephesians 4:1-6. I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, <sup>3</sup> making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: 4 there is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism, <sup>6</sup> one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. [a]

I have continued to reflect on this passage in light of who we are called to be as the body of Christ—a people who interact with one another in a posture of humility, with gentleness in our voices and hearts, and patience as we learn and grow, and a people who bear with one another in love, attentive to maintaining unity of the Spirit and the bond of peace. This is a tall order when we look at all that is going on around us and when we consider the broadening gaps that seem to yawn at us from everywhere.



I was able to spend time this week at a luncheon with a large group of people in our city. So many people, so many different views, and community leadership roles were represented. I'm sure they didn't all agree with each other on every single issue out there. But as I walked among them and met new friends and learned about the new community in which I live. I was afforded a glance at what the Kingdom of God might look like: unity in the ideal of being peace-makers. They may all approach peace from different angles, but the joy they experienced in one another's presence demonstrated such a focus on their mission of peace.

As a body of Christ, we are called to be peacemakers, too. We are called to that ideal for the sake of unity in the body and for the purpose of love. We may not all agree on every aspect of how we live out our faith all the time. But as we work it out, it is important for us to bear with one another in love for the sake of our witness to the world as to who Jesus is and how He has loved us as individuals and as a community.

I look forward to continuing our walk together...step by intentional step.




So, kids! Bring your grandparents (or friends and neighbors who are like grandparents!), and grandparents bring your grandchildren, so we can all worship

We also take for granted that we have a place to safely lie down at night and rest our heads. Recently, we received a request from a woman who, along with a few adult family members and minor age relatives, were staying at a shelter. They haven't been able to obtain proper housing. They were able to find a campground to stay at but needed a tent to be able to house all of them and stay together. Luckily, we found a



three-room tent at Walmart that they could pick up the same day. When you wake up in the morning, come home from a



day at work or school or are just hanging around your secure, warm home, take a moment to pray for those less fortunate. Ask yourself what you can do to help those in your community that might not have a safe warm place to go to at the end of their day, especially as the cold weather approaches. By giving to Local Relief, you can help one person or maybe an entire family. The money could put a temporary roof over someone's head, help pay for an application to get into an apartment, furniture, etc. You can contribute to our efforts to assist our Local Relief at any time by notating on the memo line of your check, giving envelope or notating while giving online.

# Welcome to the Trustees' Corner

Time marches on and so does the progress of the renovations. The majority of the new plumbing is installed, which was quite a feat. They say it takes a village to raise a child...it took a village to get through the plumbing installation and process. Historical prints and documents weren't quite clear. Thank goodness for the teamwork of our General Contractor, the plumbers, and the City of Lancaster. They all worked together to straighten out what the actual flow of the existing sewage and water lines was in order to get the new plumbing installed for the integrity of the infrastructure to last for many

years into the future. The ditches are starting to be filled back in. Mid-September, the electricians came on site to start their process. Here is the latest update on figures. To date we have received a little over \$1.167 million cash. Reminder that the overall job cost ended up coming in at a little over \$2.1 million leaving almost \$933k in cost above what we have received to date through the Capital Campaign. We are grateful for all the gifts given thus far to the Capital Campaign, any additional giving in your heart would be greatly appreciated to help make up for the difference between the project cost and the cash received to date. Be sure to stay tuned each month and read our article.






