Christmas/New Year's Worship Schedule at First UMC

We will again celebrate the gift of the Christ child this year through our times of candlelight worship, as has been our longtime tradition. We will keep the same schedule as last year. We will offer a time of worship on Christmas Eve-Eve, on December 23rd, at 7:30 p.m. On Dec. 24th, Christmas Eve, we will offer worship times of 5:30 and 8:00 p.m.

These options allow you to choose the day and time that work best for you and your family as we come together to celebrate the reason for the season! These options also provide flexibility for all of those that you can invite to be a part of our celebration. Please share the information about our services wherever you can. People need to experience the joy of Christ during this holiday season!

All three candlelight services on both nights are similar to one another. On Christmas Eve at the 5:30 worship, we are planning an especially family-oriented worship experience, with the praise band leading music and Pastor Amy sharing the message. Pastor Nikki will provide the message, and pipe organ and the Chancel Choir will lead music at 8:00 on Christmas Eve and on Eve-Eve at 7:30. All of the services sing wonderful Christmas carols, and all feature the candlelight singing of "Silent Night" that makes this time of worship so special. Choose a day and time, bring your family and friends, and experience the light of the Christ child as we worship together!

Because Christmas Eve is on Sunday this year, we'll change our Sunday morning schedule. We'll have only one service at 10:00 a.m., and we will worship with the reading of Scriptures and the singing of Christmas Carols.

Similarly, on Sunday, Dec. 31st, we will have one service at 10:00 a.m., which will include an updated version of the Wesley Covenant liturgy and a time of baptism renewal in connection with celebration of an infant baptism.

Let's worship together as we celebrate the holidays!

As I write, November is nearing its end. Mother Nature is reaching to the foot of her bed to pull a soft grey comforter over the dome of the earth, and the daylight hours grow shorter. With little sunlight to buoy our spirits, we go from home to work and back again, experiencing only glimmers of natural radiance. Our spirits cling to every spark of light and warmth.

It may sound strange, but this cycle from sunlight to darkness is one of my favorite times of the year. In times when natural sunlight is plentiful and it is easy to see, we take the light for granted. Our lives fly by in a blurry picture. All our senses are overwhelmed with spring rains bringing wet dirt, pale green tendrils shooting from winter-dark limbs, all the world awakening as it is kissed by the sun. Summer is life and light—birds singing, insects buzzing, everything growing and learning how to be



in the world. And then the parade of autumn golds, fiery oranges, and deep reds of changing leaves enter as September's clear-blue skies give way to crisp October mornings and smells of bonfires still smoldering. We don our flannel and warm our hands with hot coffee mugs and steaming teacups. There is steady slowing of time while the Ohio landscape loses its color and goes quiet in late November. As December stomps its boots to our doorstep, the whole world pauses with a great heave of breath—the longest nights of the year approach.

I find this pause in the December darkness thrilling because even though the nights hang heavy, I know that the light is coming. And that light is the light of Christ Jesus. Just as the light from the flame of a single candle can illuminate an entire dark room, the light of Christ Jesus banishes all the darkness in the world.

So, even as the darkest months of the year approach, I am giddy in hopeful expectation that the true light that enlightens everyone is coming into the world. And the best part? We *get* to be witnesses to that light. Standing in the presence of the light of Christ, our own flames ignite. When we step through the door to the new year, we are sent to testify to the light in all we think, say and do. It's so exciting!

So, let's experience Christmas with all our senses this year. If you have not opted to join a small group for our Advent study, I invite you to read along with us Matt Rawle's *Experiencing Christmas: Christ in the Sights and Sounds of Advent.* Join us weekly in worship! Come, sing and serve with us. May you be filled with the joy of gathering in community to worship the Triune God. We are witnesses to the light of Christ. Take your candle, go light the world!


Children's Ministry Weather Emergency Plan

GriefShare: A support group to help you move

No matter what the circumstances, grief is a painful, confusing process. A GriefShare support group is a safe, welcoming place

where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Through this 13-week group, you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability—and gain solid support each step of the way.

At each weekly meeting, you will view a video featuring respected counselors, pastors, and healthcare professionals on grief-related topics, plus you'll hear relatable personal stories of grief. After that is a small-group discussion to allow people time to talk, share support, and personally apply what they learned on the video. Everyone will receive a book to take home filled with valuable exercises for navigating their personal grieving process.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to all of you. Even though the holiday season is upon us, the renovations continue to march on. For those that have been able to attend church in

person, you have seen the new sidewalks on the High Street side of the church. The new foundation and stairwell on the west side of the building have been poured. The stairwell to the basement used to be north and south and now is east and west. Regardless of the direction, it looks just as nice as the new sidewalks on the east side of the building. Here are pictures of them. They are beautiful and smooth. The electricians have finished the underground electrical and will

electricians have finished the underground electrical and will have filled the trenches with new cement by the time you read this. To date, we have received a little over \$1.173 million cash. Reminder that the overall job cost ended up coming in at a little over \$2.1 million, leaving almost \$927k in cost above what we have received to date through the Capital Campaign. We are grateful for all the gifts given thus far to the Capital Campaign, any additional giving in your heart would be greatly appreciated to help make up for the difference between the project cost and the cash received to date. 








"Emmet Otter's Jug Band Christmas"
