

Luke 5:1-4 One day when Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, the people were crowding around him and listening to the word of God. He saw at the water's edge two boats left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down your nets for a catch."

In her first sermon of 2024, Pastor Amy invited us to take a "Star Word" and focus our attention on that word for the year. I hope that each of you have received your word and have been focusing on your guiding word for 2024. My star word is receive, I have placed it on my large computer screen so that I remember to receive fresh perspective from God throughout my day. I have been watching the Chosen on Netflix and am receiving fresh perspective as I watch and then pour over Scripture to find the stories there. The series is well-researched, and I'm finding it very engaging. It is a different way for me to deepen my walk with Christ and my understanding of Scripture.



At the printing of this newsletter, we are just weeks away from Ash Wednesday (February 14) and the Season of Lent. Lent is a forty-day period set aside annually for introspection, acknowledgment of our sins, and a time of repentance and asking for God's forgiveness. It is a clearing season of the soul.

During Lent, followers of Jesus transition from a time of anticipation and wonder at the star's appearing with us to the stark reality of our wavering devotion as Christ finally walks in our midst. We move from the season of **wondering** to **wandering**. This year at FUMC, our Lenten journey will be guided by one of Jesus' twelve chosen disciples, Peter. I find that Peter is easy to relate to. He's down to earth, passionate, eager to be a part of Jesus' mission, but sometimes his heart *wanders*. In essence, Peter was a regular human being doing his best to follow where Christ was leading. He was trying to figure it out—just like we are.

During the Lenten Season, we fast or deny ourselves things we enjoy so that we might join with Christ as He went alone into the desert to fast and pray for forty days after His baptism. Fasting, prayer and self-denial are all ways to help us look at our own lives. But remember that Jesus met Peter at the water's edge—where Peter already was—and then called him to put out into deeper water for a catch. Internally, what did it take for Peter to move into deeper water? I am curious, if Jesus asked you to put out into deeper water, what would that mean for you? What would you be willing to set aside so that you could pursue your relationship with God in a focused way? What next step will you take this Lenten Season? Join me starting on Ash Wednesday, February 14, in observing a holy Lent. Join us in person or online each week for our worship and sermon series, Wandering Heart: Figuring Out Our Faith with Peter.

Pastor Amy and I invite you to join us in observing a holy Lent. One way to engage in our faith journey during this six weeks of introspection is to commit to reading Scripture and meditating on it regularly. This Lenten season, we will be providing one *Wandering Heart Devotional Booklet* per family. Each week's devotional material will help us to connect to Peter's journey of faith through fresh eyes and ears as we experience his story through art, poetry, song and scripture. 

Connect with the Pastors


