Living the Resurrection

"I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He isn't here! He is risen from the dead, just as He said would happen." Matthew 28:5b-6a NLT

This Lenten Season, we have walked with Peter as he followed Jesus. At one point in the journey, Jesus tells Peter and the disciples that He will suffer and die. Peter wants to hear no word of this because in his mind, Messiah would not have to undergo suffering and hope would die if Messiah died. But Jesus is not exactly what Peter and everyone else was expecting. He reprimands Peter, reminding him not to think in human terms, but divine ones.

In about a week, Easter Sunday will have come and gone. The remorse we feel at the foot of the Cross on Good Friday will have been overcome by the joy we feel at Jesus' rising on Resurrection morning. But I wonder, in our desire to follow Jesus, do we allow gravity to pull us back toward the cross or do we fly from the tomb with Jesus and let the joy of Resurrection guide our faithful living? I'm not saying that we must choose between remembering the Cross and living the Resurrection. But I am suggesting that we live in such a way that our remembering the cross does not overshadow the joy of the Resurrection.



Matthew's gospel narrative ends with the women finding the grave empty, religious leaders bribing the guards of the tomb to lie and say Jesus' followers took Him, and Jesus meeting with His disciples "on the mountain where He told them to go" to commission them for ministry. Mark's gospel has two endings, the first of which is the women fleeing from the empty tomb after seeing a man in bright white clothes there who told them to go tell the disciples what they had seen. The second ending leaves us with Jesus commissioning His disciples and ascending to heaven. John's gospel ends with Jesus restoring Peter after Peter's denial and abandonment, then commissioning Peter to feed His sheep—or care for the community of believers. And finally, Luke's gospel ends with the promise of His continued guidance through the Holy Spirit that He will send after He ascends. But Luke does not stop with this promise at Jesus' ascension, he writes a Part II—what happens afterward, in light of all that has transpired (See the Acts of the Apostles).

The events leading up to the Resurrection were horrible, tragic, and heart-wrenching. But God, through Christ, redeemed every bit of the suffering, tragic, heart-wrenching horror in the Resurrection. Love conquered the Cross and the inhumane suffering of Jesus. Love conquered sin, being sent into the world in a new way to cover all the ugliness humanity can muster and transform it into something new and good. Love conquered even death itself.

The good news is that in and through Christ, we are made new. And in our newness, we live as beloved and redeemed children of God, called to celebrate our redemption as we live our lives for the glory of God. Friends, we still journey toward the cross, but on Easter morning, the cross is empty. The tomb is empty. Christ is risen! So, let us live our lives in certain hope of the Resurrection! Amen!

Welcome to the Trustees' Corner


During the process of the Capital Campaign renovations, we have been maintaining a spreadsheet tracking available funds, money spent to date, the original job cost, change orders, etc. in order to watch our remainder funds balance. Through the course of the passing months, we accidentally forgot to add the architect and engineer fees to the original job cost list. This accidental oversight changes our overall job cost to a little over \$2.2 million instead of \$2.1 million. To date, we have received a little over \$1.2 million in cash, leaving almost \$1 million in cost above what we have received to date through the Capital Campaign. We have been able to fill some of the gap with the proceeds from the Rising House sale along with some generous bequeaths/gifts. We are grateful for all the gifts given thus far to the Capital Campaign, any additional giving in your heart would be greatly appreciated to help make up for the difference between the project cost and the cash received to date. The renovations are moving along in most of the basement. The Fellowship Hall area and open classrooms are coming along nicely with fresh paint, new floor and drop ceiling being installed. The new ADA bathrooms have tile installed, and countertops have been ordered. The electricians continue to plug along with replacing

old wiring and changing out fuse boxes in preparation for the new electric coming into the building when the switch gear arrives. The kitchen is still a

large work in progress and will be one of the last areas to be completed. Your continued patience is appreciated. Be sure to stay tuned each month and read our article.

Dear Friends of Lithuania.

I am writing to share good news that Bishop Alsted, District Superintendents Remigijus Matulaitis (Lithuania) and Edgars Sneider (Latvia) applied to the General Board of Global Ministries for a missionary position in Lithuania with some responsibilities in Latvia. The missionary position is approved by GBGM and the search process for suitable candidates is in progress.

There is not sufficient pastoral capacity in the Baltic Annual Conference, especially after the Estonia district disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church. A person (or a couple) with strong leadership, teaching and coaching skills would be needed to strengthen the current pastors in the conference and identifying new candidates to pastoral ministry. Several churches in Lithuania have had to manage without proper pastoral oversight, which is not healthy for sustainable development of the church.

Responsibilities of this missionary position:

- Serving as pastor in 2-3 local churches (an interpreter will be needed)
- Sharing the story of the ministry of the UMC in Lithuania and Latvia
 - Leadership development in the local churches
 - Participate in leadership training on a district level (Lithuania)
 - Develop and lead a leadership training program (Latvia)

The missionary couple/missionary will live in Lithuania in either Birzai, Vilkaviškis or Kaunas. Travel monthly or bi-monthly to Latvia.

Although GBGM covers many of the costs associated with the missionary position, there will be a need to do fundraising to cover some of the program costs such as transportation, translation, and a one-time cost of a car purchase.



<u>Visitation Ministers Needed!</u>

A church member that delivers our Sweet Treats monthly to persons who are homebound recently shared with me that, having acted on God's nudging, she has found these visits are as meaningful to her as they are to those she visits. I invite you to consider visitation as a spiritual practice instead of simply being a volunteer. Our call to serve is included in our vows of church membership, utilizing the gifts God created within us. I encourage you to listen carefully for God's nudging, and become involved either

- as a 'Sharing Hearts' minister who creates relationship with one (or more) of our homebound members through at least two contacts each month; a greeting card, a phone call, or a personal visit which could include Holy Communion, and/or
- as a 'Hospital Visitation Minister' who visits members/friends of the church who are hospitalized or request prayer before surgery/a procedure.

Training is provided and each minister will receive a name badge identifying them as representing our church family. Individuals, couples and families are encouraged to become involved, serving those who can no longer physically attend church or participate in our ministries. In the famous quote by Hillel, a first-century Jewish scholar, "If not you, then who? If not now, then when?" YOU are needed and wanted.

A Good Problem!

Our church is experiencing a wonderful problem on Sunday mornings – we are providing transportation to the 9am service from all over town! Our church van presently picks up both on the far east side of town (Tiki Lane/188 area) and on the far west side of town (Fair Avenue and Cedar Hill Road area), with an additional recent request for another pick up near the fairgrounds. We currently have four weeks each month covered by four people (two individuals and one couple) and we frequently have to ask these loyal people to also drive for 'fifth Sundays' or special services, e.g., Holy Week, mid-week Christmas services, etc. In addition, we cannot always provide transportation for individuals who wish to attend events or ministry opportunities at Crossroads or the church.

There are two ways in which you could help in this ministry:

Adding your name to the list of approved drivers for the van, and/or

Providing a ride to/from church for another when you come to church.








Orphan Train (Audiobook)

A lovely novel about the search for family that also happens to illuminate a fascinating and forgotten chapter of American history. By Christina Baker Kline




