# **Experiencing Christmas Churchwide Advent Study**

Deepen your appreciation of the Christmas season with intimate small group fellowship. During Advent, FUMC will be doing a church-wide small group study of *Experiencing Christmas: Christ in the Sights and Sounds of Christmas* by Matt Rawle. We hope you can participate!

#### How will it work?

Each week, the sermon will introduce the topic of the week. Participants will then read the corresponding chapter in their book. Each small group will meet once during the week to watch the accompanying video segment and discuss the material in the chapter.

#### When does it start?

The first sermon for the study will be November 26<sup>th</sup>. Then the groups will start meeting. Groups should meet once each week.

- Week 1: November 26<sup>th</sup> December 2<sup>nd</sup>
- Week 2: December 3rd 9th
- Week 3: December 10<sup>th</sup> 16<sup>th</sup>
- · Week 4: December 17<sup>th</sup> − 23<sup>rd</sup>

## How do I join?

There will be a number of groups to choose from – some during the day and some in the evening. Most will be in-person but there will be at least one on Zoom. The full schedule of groups will be available on our website by November. To join a group, you can sign up online with the link on our website or add your name on the sign-up sheet in the parlor.

You will need to purchase your own participant guide online (\$15-\$20). There will be limited copies at the church for folks who are having trouble buying it online.

# O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever! Psalm 118:1

In the United States, November is the month in which we are focused on giving thanks. On the fourth Thursday of November every year, we gather at a table with family and friends and we spend the day sharing a special meal and enjoying one another's company. As a faithful people of God, however, we are called to dedicate ourselves to living our entire lives in gratitude.

When Jesus healed the leper (Matthew 8:1-4), He told the man not to "tell" everyone about it, but to "show" the priest, give the proper offering according to the commandments of Moses for healing, but then to demonstrate with his life, his gratitude to God for the gift of his life. The Message paraphrase says it like this: "Don't talk about this all over town. Just quietly present your healed body to the priest, along with the appropriate expressions of thanks to God. Your cleansed and grateful life, not your words, will bear witness to what I have done."



In other translations, the leper is to offer his gift at the temple as "testimony" to the people. Testimony is "evidence in support of a statement." Jesus told the man not to go talk about his healing, but to live a life that offered evidence to support that he had been healed by the power of God through Jesus.

In her book, *Grateful: The Transformative Power of Giving Thanks*, Diana Butler Bass offers, "Gratitude is, however, more than just an emotion. It is also a disposition that can be chosen and cultivated, an outlook toward life that manifests itself in actions—it is an ethic." A life of gratitude is more than a happy feeling that we have received the gift of new life in Christ Jesus. Rather, the gift of grace transforms us and it changes how we choose to live. Our lives become the evidence that God's grace, given to us in Christ Jesus, is transformative. And what better way to prepare our hearts for the season of Advent than to focus ourselves on living lives that demonstrate God's love alive and active in God's people?


I invite you to do some holy work with me starting this month—to adopt an ethic of gratitude. Make gratitude more than a feeling, be intentional about making gratitude a way of life. How could it do any less than change us as individuals? How could it do any less than transform our community?

I am grateful for the life I have been given and the new life I have received in Christ Jesus. I am grateful that my family and I have been called here and that I have been given the opportunity to serve with you all. Thanks be to God!

# Welcome to the Trustees' Corner

It's homecoming season at most high schools this time of year. An event where the high school kids show off their latest dance moves. Well, it's been like a dance of sorts lately with the Capital Campaign renovations. The contractors are not doing funky dances or even a mosh pit, but they seem to be dancing in a collective way one would think was choreographed. The electricians are more than sixty percent through their installation. Unfortunately, even when they complete their process internally, we will still be at the mercy of supply and demand for the new switch gear, external electrical components. One of the contractors has been digging and prepping for the new location for the kitchen grease interceptor. Still a lot of moving parts and still more to be done, but things are continuing to come along. To date, we have received a little over \$1.170 million cash. Reminder that the overall job cost ended up coming in at a little over \$2.1 million,

leaving almost \$930k in cost above what we have received to date through the Capital Campaign. We are grateful for all the gifts given thus far to the Capital Campaign, any additional giving in your heart would be greatly appreciated to help make up for the difference between the project cost and the cash received to date. Be sure to stay tuned each month

and read our article.


## **Library News**
